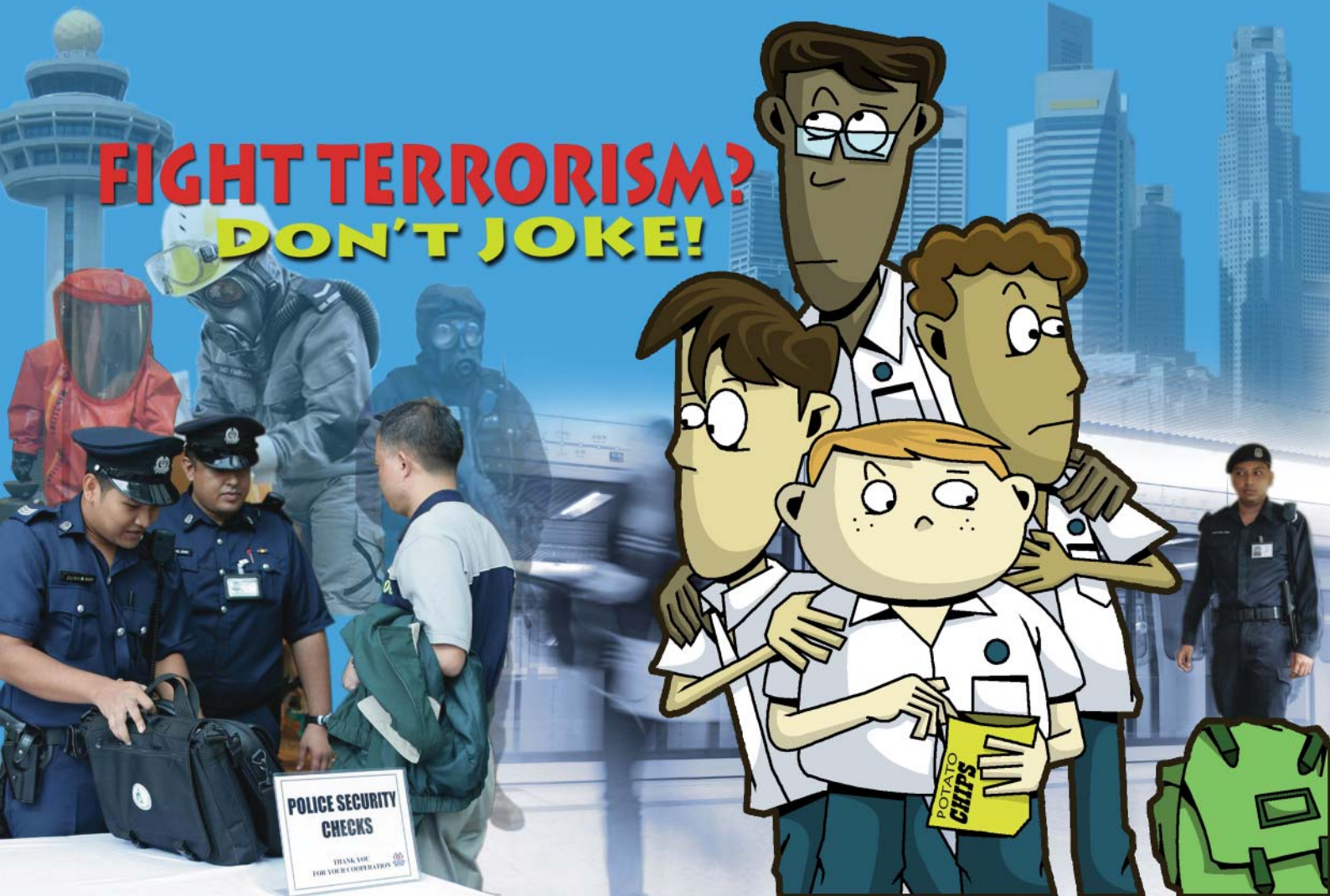

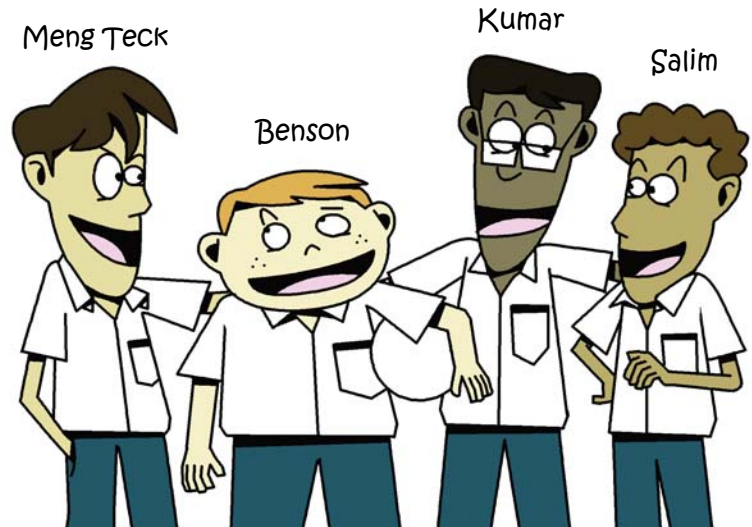

# About the Characters

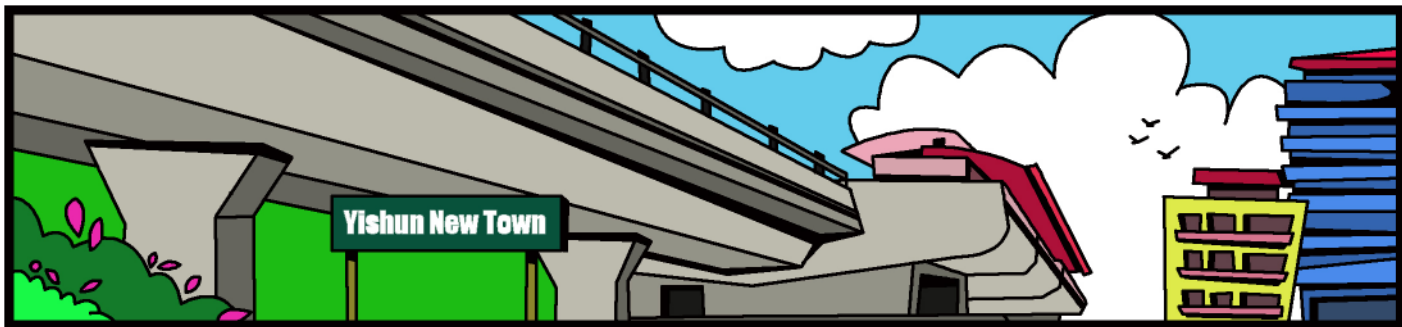
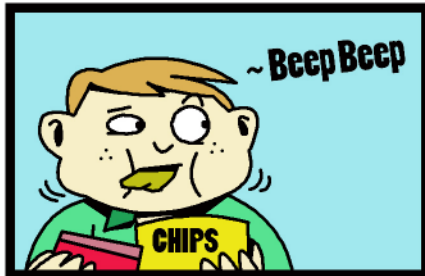

The Police MRT Unit was set up in August 2005 to enhance MRT security.

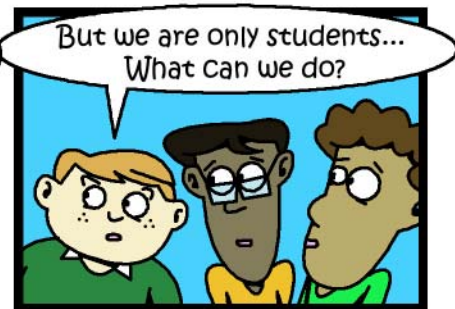


... conduct security checks on facilities, commuters and their belongings.

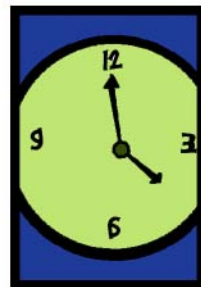
Police dogs are trained to sniff out explosives...

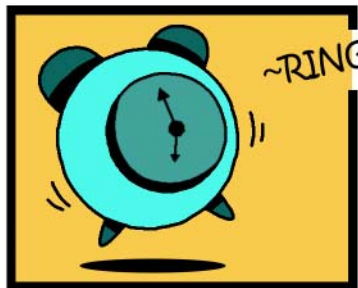


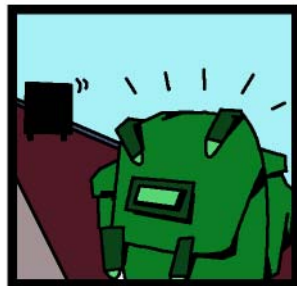
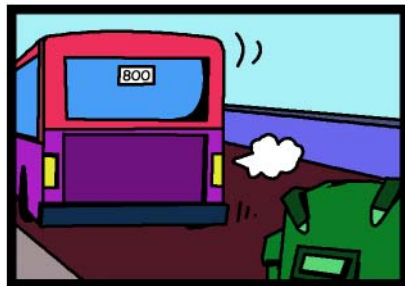
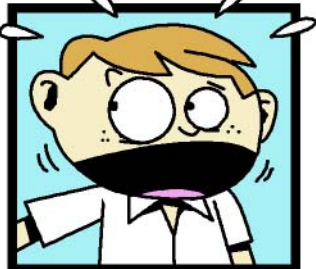
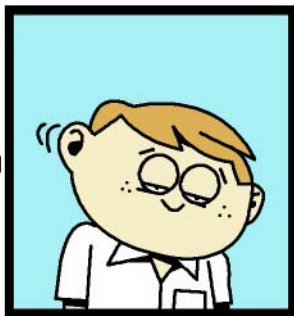
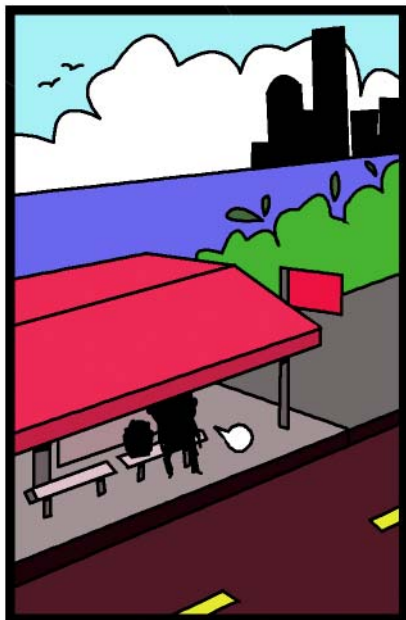

What!

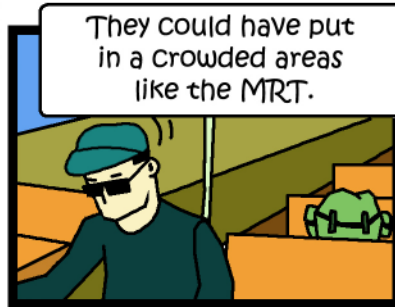
Bomb!



Correct. The terrorists could use the bag to hold explosives, ...



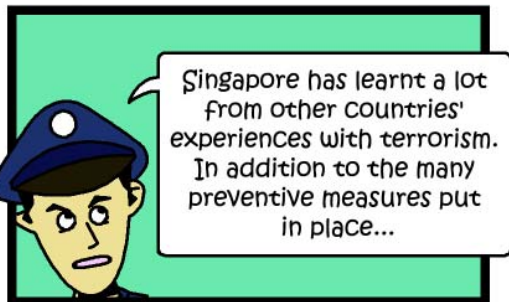
They could have put in a crowded areas like the MRT.

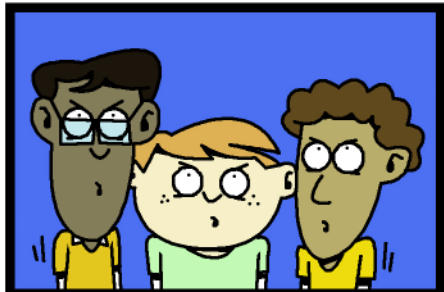

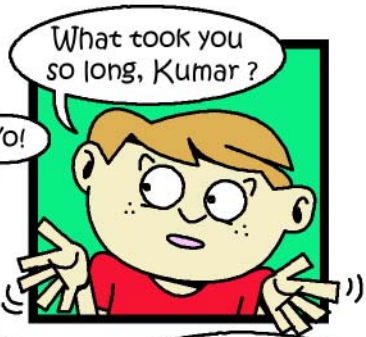


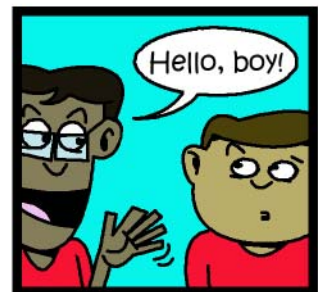

... the metal detectors are also used to ensure that people do not carry dangerous weapons with them.



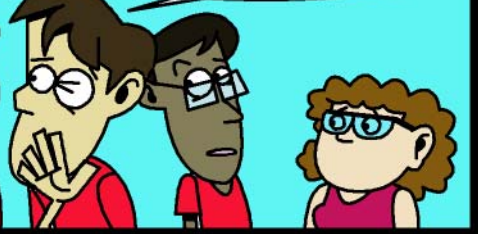

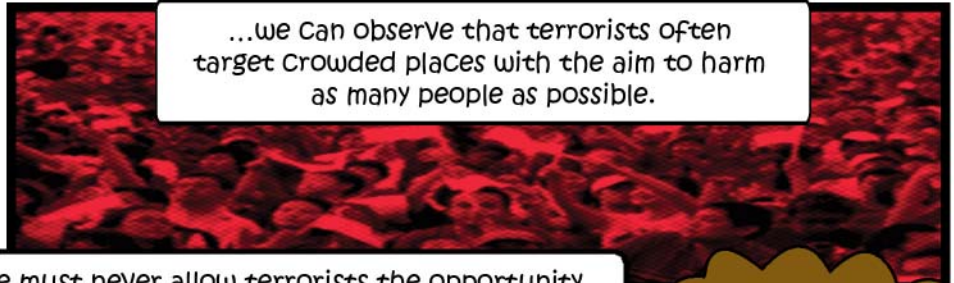
Singapore is a target for transnational terrorism because of our stand against it...

Combating the terrorists will require more than our security forces...

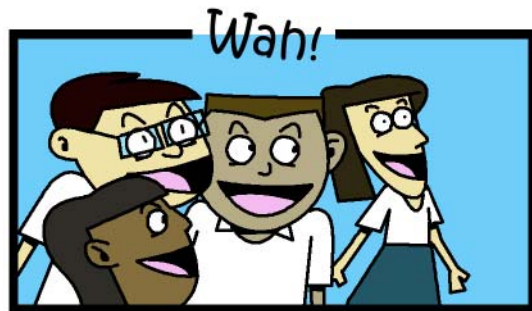
...we must also play our part and stay vigilant... and firmly uphold our multi-racial, multi-religious way of life.

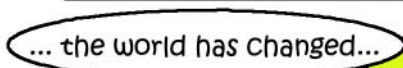
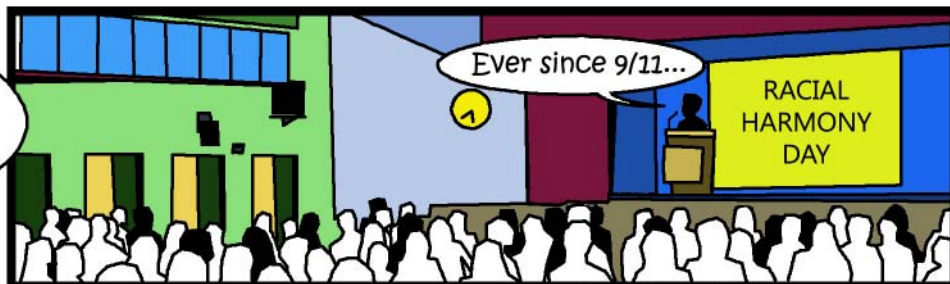

At the same time, even with the most comprehensive security measures, we cannot presume that we are immune.



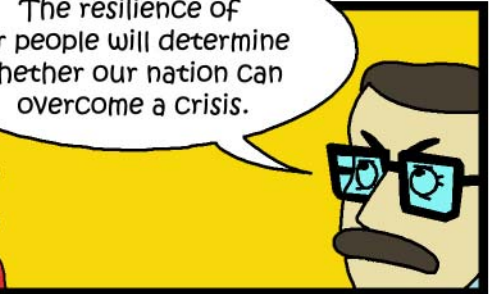
So in addition, we must build resilience.

In both cases, the people rallied together, mounted rescue operations...

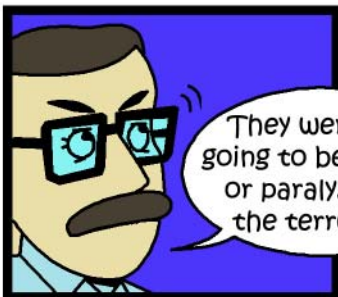
and carried on with life as usual.

Londoners used the very same public transport system that was attacked.



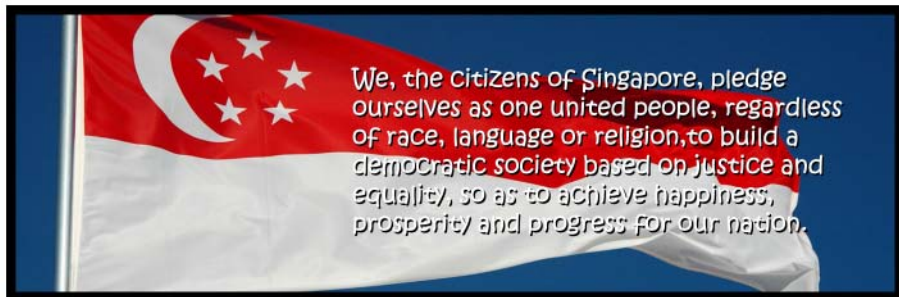
They were not going to be cowed or paralysed by the terrorists.



The idea is to get back to our normal lives as quickly as possible...

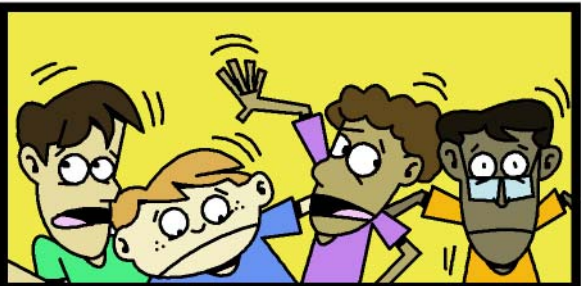
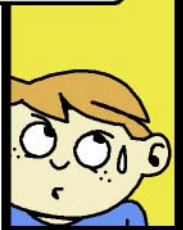


That's the best way to show the terrorists that they have failed!

...and escape through the emergency exit in the tunnel

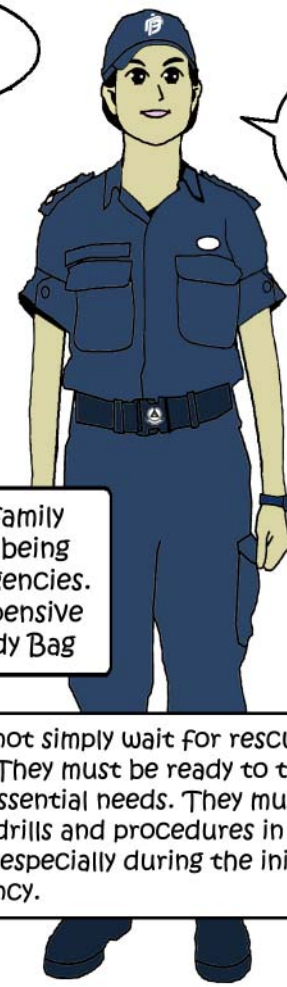




Well done students! You have successfully completed the Detrainment Drill



Let me introduce you to your instructor for the rest of the Emergency Preparedness Camp...



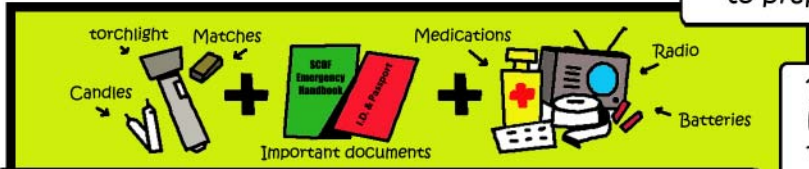
Hi guys, I'm CPT Tan Ai Lin from SCDF

My first lesson for today is "How to pack your Ready Bag".

Everyone in the family can play a part in being prepared for emergencies. It is easy and inexpensive to prepare a Ready Bag



Besides the torchlight, the bag is also packed with important documents, personal medications and other essential items that one can grab quickly and take to a shelter or any off-site location during evacuation.

People cannot simply wait for rescue agencies to help them. They must be ready to take care of their own essential needs. They must also know emergency drills and procedures in order to know what to do especially during the initial stages of any emergency.

Day Two: The Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Training.

In times of emergency, we must not only be able to save ourselves but also help others in need...



I shall now show you the correct method of performing Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR).

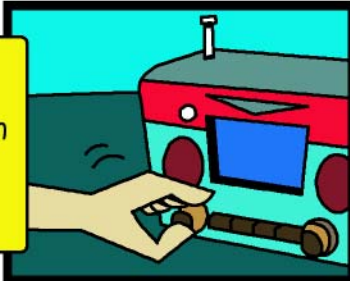
Day Three: In-Place Protection Exercise

door gaps...



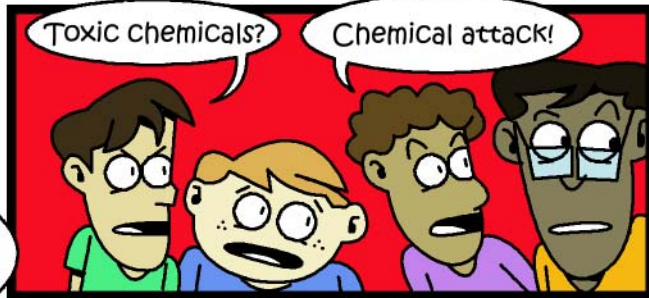
We're currently facing the threat of toxic chemicals...

Chemical attack!







This "In-Place Protection" exercise is to prepare us for the situation when toxic chemical clouds are moving towards our school...

And how long will that take?



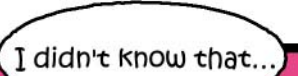
Don't worry, it is only for a short while... about 3 to 4 hours.



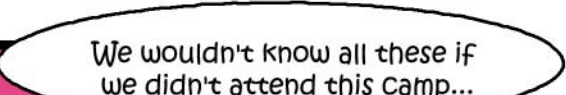
Also, do note that not all chemical agents are visible...
